## **EX PARTE APPLICATION IN CHAMBERS**

- 1. An Application is an original proceeding and a motion is an interlocutory step in a proceeding. A person may bring an *ex parte* application where it is appropriate to seek an order without notice to another person.
- 2. In your document you <u>must</u> set out the reasons why you believe it would be appropriate for the judge to hear you alone without notice to other persons.
- 3. An ex parte application generally takes less than half an hour, can be heard Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday at 9:30 a.m.
- **4.** The documents required are:
  - a) Ex Parte application (Form 5.02),
  - **b)** supporting Affidavit (Form 39.08),
  - **c)** Brief (two copies required)
  - d) three (3) draft orders (Form 78.05)

and must be filed at least two (2) days before the date set for the hearing of the application (Civil Procedure Rule 5.02 (5)).

- **Note:** the Brief is a concise statement of the grounds for the order, including the material facts the applicant seeks to establish and a reference to legislation relied on by the applicant.
- 6. Time is calculated in accordance with Civil Procedure Rule 94 this means you do <u>not</u> count the day you file the documents <u>nor</u> do you count the hearing date. You count two (2) days in between <u>excepting</u> Saturday, Sunday or a day the Prothonotary's Office is closed.
- 7. The filing fee is \$218.05 and law stamp fee of \$25.00 + HST required at time of filing.
