SECTION 320.18(1) of the *Criminal Code of Canada* states:

Everyone commits an offence who operates a conveyance while prohibited from doing so

- (a) by an order made under this Act; or
- (b) by any other form of legal restriction imposed under any other Act of Parliament or under provincial law in respect of a conviction under this Act or a discharge under section 730.

SECTION 320.19(5) of the *Criminal Code of Canada* states:

Every person who commits an offence under subsection 320.13(1) or 320.16(1), section 320.17 or subsection 320.18(1) is guilty of

- (a) an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than 10 years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction.
