

## ADVISORY: WEBCAST OF COURT PROCEEDING

## CAC-514477 - His Majesty the King v Colin Hugh Tweedie

On July 11, 2019, Talia Forrest died when she was struck by a vehicle while riding her bicycle on Black Rock Road in Cape Breton Regional Municipality. The driver of the vehicle, Colin Hugh Tweedie, did not stop at the scene of the collision.

Mr. Tweedie was later charged with dangerous operation of a motor vehicle causing death, impaired driving causing death, failing to stop at an accident involving death, and obstruction of justice. He pleaded guilty to obstruction and was acquitted of the remaining charges following a trial in Sydney Supreme Court in February 2022. The Crown is now appealing Mr. Tweedie's acquittals.

The appeal hearing is scheduled for a half day, starting at 2 p.m. AST on Thursday, Jan. 19, 2023. This matter will be heard by a three-member panel comprised of Chief Justice Michael Wood, Justice Cindy Bourgeois and Justice Anne Derrick.
