## **Proper Form of Address for Presiding Justices of the Peace**

## **December 17, 2024**

The proper form of address for Presiding Justices of the Peace is 'Your Worship'.

## Background:

Justices of the Peace are composed of three distinct classifications:

- 1) The Administrative Justice of the Peace;
- 2) The Staff Justice of the Peace; and
- 3) The Presiding Justice of the Peace.

The scope of judicial duties for each classification is set out in the <u>Justice of the Peace Act</u>, RSNS 1989, c 244, and the associated <u>Justices of the Peace Regulations</u>, NS Reg. 51/2002. Neither the *Act*, nor the regulations, set out the proper form of address.

This Notice addresses expressed confusion from the public, and members of the Bar, about how to address a Presiding Justice of the Peace who presides in summary conviction court over non-criminal offences such as those under the *Motor Vehicle Act*, hears *Emergency Protection Act* applications, and reviews search warrants.

Your Worship, the standard form of address used in many provinces across the country, is an historic honorific used in commonwealth countries to address a Justice of the Peace.

At the start of summary conviction court proceedings, the clerk will introduce the Presiding Justice of the Peace as "His/Her Worship, Presiding Justice of the Peace (name)," and counsel and self-represented litigants will address them as "Your Worship".
